President's Report

PERC President and CEO Roy Willis offered updates on the formation of a task force on vehicle conversion safety and training, on a recent meeting about the industry's breakthrough innovation priorities, and on the upcoming North American-European summit of the World LP Gas Association in Washington.

Mr. Willis asked the Council for authorization to create and fill a staff engineer position to support the growing number of engine-based projects in the Council's research and development portfolio. Doug Rinke made a motion to approve the request, and the motion was adopted unanimously.
